| Final Test | All trainees need to pass a final exam in order to complete the course. The minimum pass grade is 85%. If a trainee fails for the first time, he/she will be given a second attempt at the exam. If a trainee fails on the second attempt, they will have to retake the entire course. |
| Certification | Once the trainee has passed the final exam, they will be provided with an e-Certificate which can be printed. The certificate is then valid for 60 months. |
